# <sup>®</sup>KIPSY Caterpillar Cake Ideas

Why not make some ©KIPSY cakes to share with your friends or even sell for donations to the Making Me charity?

## INGREDIENTS TO MAKE 2 KIPSYs

- 115 + 100g butter softened
- 115g caster sugar
- 125g self-raising flour
- 1tsp baking powder
- 2 large eggs
- 1 + 1 tbsp semi-skimmed milk
- 200g icing sugar
- 1/4tsp vanilla extract
- Coloured icing or writing icing
- Sweet treats like M&Ms, fizzy laces, dolly mixture, cherries or raisins
- 12 paper cases and a bun tray
- Display boards or plates

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### METHOD

- Preheat the oven to 180C/160C Fan/Gas 4. Line bun tray.
- Cream together 115g of butter with the caster sugar, then slowly beat in the eggs, flour, baking powder, and 1tbsp of the milk until creamy.
- Divide the mixture evenly between the paper cases.
- Bake for 18-20 minutes then transfer to a wire rack to cool.
- Mix the remaining butter with the icing sugar until smooth, then add the rest of the milk and the vanilla extract.
- Beat 'til creamy then spread your mix on top of the cakes.

• Take 2 of cakes to make two faces. You can using writing icing to draw on glasses and smiley mouth. We used a dolly mixture nose. For the antennae, try threading fizzy laces on cocktail sticks to help them stand up\* and top each one off with M&Ms, glace cherries or a couple of raisins.

• Spell ©KIPSY on the remaining cakes. We used coloured icing, but you could make letters from mini Smarties or M&Ms. We also used hundreds & thousands for extra zing!

 Place the cakes in order on your display plate. As a finishing touch, add fizzy laces with M&Ms, cherries or raisins on the end for the legs. You can use leftover icing as "glue."



There's nothing like nature to put a smile on your face. Here are some ideas for encouraging wildlife into your home or garden.

# 1) Plants

Plant wildflower seeds in your garden or maybe in a window box made from an old margarine or ice cream tub.

Did you know you can grow edible plants like tomatoes, mint or even nasturtium flowers?

You could also do a sunflower growing competition with friends and family?

Some people say talking to plants helps them to grow. You can also sprinkle tea leaves from used tea bags around your plants to provide helpful nutrients. And don't forget to water them.

# 2) Insects

Bumblebees are an important part of our gardens. Don't be scared, they only sting if you sit on them or pick them up.

The wild flowers you planted will help bees & other insects, and you can also leave water in shallow saucers with stones in to help them drink.

Why not make a bug hotel to welcome insects? Cut out the side of an old milk carton and stack it with the cardboard toilet roll inner tubes. Stuff these with moss, grass, pine cones and paper to make it cosy. You could decorate the top with daisy chain bunting!

# 3) Birds

Making bird feeders is a great way to encourage feathered friends into the garden.

If you have an old apple with brown spots, cut it in half, scoop out the core and seeds, then stuff the hole with a bird seed and peanut butter. You can then hang it from a tree.

Or try taking the peel of half an eaten orange and filling it with seeds or nuts. Poke four holes in the rind and thread twine through the holes to create a hanging basket.

Put them up high so cats can't get to them. And put out fresh water in a saucer.



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# **«KIPSY's Insect Hotel**



Why not make your own Insect Hotel to encourage caterpillars and their friends into your garden?

# WHAT YOU NEED

- Empty milk carton
- Sharp knife
- Scissors
- Mix of pebbles, sticks, flowers, pine cones, leaves and weeds
- Toilet roll tubes
- Glue (optional)
- Hole punch
- Insect Hotel sign



Cut the handle corner off your carton to create the base for your insect hotel. Use the knife to pierce a hole, then use the scissors to cut the hotel outline.




To make a mini maze for your insects, punch holes into the toilet roll tubes and poke sticks through. The insects will enjoy exploring!

Build up the interior of your hotel in layers starting with heavier things like pebbles first. Pop in the toilet rolls complete with mini climbing frames. Add in flowers and greenery for colour. You can glue the pieces together to make it sturdier if you like.



Add your Insect Hotel sign, carry it carefully to the garden and you're open for business!





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# «KIPSY Cress Caterpillar



Why not make a ©KIPSY cress caterpillar? You can make egg & cress sandwiches to share or even sell for Making Me?


## WHAT YOU NEED

- 3 toilet roll inner tubes
- Scissors, pencil
- Ruler, glue
- Cotton buds
- Cotton wool
- Cress seeds
- KIPSY's face and name template

Flatten a toilet roll and crease the edges. Cut it in half. Then, fold each piece in half again so that you make two squares.




Measure half way up each piece, then make a cut at each corner from the bottom to the line. Fold the flaps inwards and glue to make a base. Repeat for the other half, and the other loo rolls.





Use felt tips or paints to colour the six boxes.

Now draw and colour ©KIPSY's face and name, or print the template overleaf. Cut out and stick on. Colour the cotton buds black, cut off the ends and




push them into the boxes to make legs and antennae, or stick with glue.

Fill each box with cotton wool and sprinkle cress seeds on top. Keep them watered until they grow.






# Why not make a ©KIPSY out of wool scraps? You can keep your very own ©KIPSY on display at school or at home!

### WHAT YOU NEED

- Cardboard, yoghurt pot, coin
- Pencil, glue, scissors
- Colourful wool
- Fabric scraps
- Glue
- Pipe cleaners
- Googly eyes

Draw round the yoghurt pot onto the cardboard and the coin in the middle. Mark a wedge, then cut out the C. Make a 2<sup>nd</sup> C the same.




Line the 2 cardboard Cs side by side, then lie the end of your first choice of wool against the card. Wind the wool through the wedge gap, and round and round the circle until you've covered it thickly.




Hold onto the middle with your thumb and cut the wool by putting the scissors between the two Cs. Take an extra length of wool and wind it around the middle, between the cardboard Cs. Tie a tight knot. Now take off the cardboard – ta da, a pom pom! Make five more, enough for KIPSY's body and head.





Now thread small lengths of pipe cleaner through the knotted wool to make legs and antennae. Draw & cut out the letters on your fabric, and a big smile too. Put some eyes in pipe cleaner glasses. Glue it all together. Yay a cuddly ©KIPSY!
